Cow Moose Feeding in Beaver Pond

When she comes near, her long-legged body stands only eight feet from me.

Today's exploration of this small beaver pond had me encountering two black bears, a cow moose, and a doe white-tail deer with a newborn fawn, among other wild creatures. Mother Nature displays her grand bounty. I am indebted to her.
